GANONG NATURE PARK
A 350 acre natural park, featuring a spectacular coastline that overlooks the St. Croix River. The park has woods, fields, many trails and 180 acres of intertidal area.

OLD TRAIN STATION

THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN ST. STEPHEN



GARCELON CIVIC CENTER
Go for a swim, skate, workout in the gym or check out an event at St. Stephen's brand new multi-purpose facility.



HISTORIC BUILDINGS
View the diverse architectural delights around the town, including Todd Mansion (1890), Park Hall (1876) and Lonicer Hall (1841)



RIVERFRONT WALKING TRAIL
Take a leisurely walk along the scenic river and watch for eagles overhead or even catch a view of one 'fishing'.



LOYALIST BURIAL GROUND
Restored in 2008, The Loyalist Burial Ground is the resting place of 69 Loyalists, many of whom helped to build the town.



ST. CROIX ISLAND
Just down river from St. Stephen this 1604 outpost was one of the first attempts by France at year-round colonization of this territory.



EVENTS AND FESTIVALS
As well as Chocolate Fest, St. Stephen hosts the annual St. Stephen International Lumberjack Championship.
